**Fire Marshal Update:** Here is what is going on:

- In August we will deliver a self inspection form to all the businesses and schools. This will be a guide they can use to help prepare for our inspections. This will give them the chance to ask questions or voice concerns prior to the inspections; it will also enable them to remedy existing issues.
- We are concerned about numerous vacant / abandoned houses in our area that are severe fire hazards. We have about six we will be working on. We will contact the owner and advise them of Fire Code violations and start working to get them cleaned up. We will most likely be working with the building inspector on several of the structures.

**Animal Care and Control:** A.C.O. Bill Dixon has been staying busy with routine calls for service and planning for the new shelter. Some activity for July includes:

- Picked up 11 dogs
- Picked up 14 cats
- Set or reset 15 traps
- Responded to 2 calls for "road kill"
- Responded to 4 incidents involving wildlife (some reported in the traps)
- A total of 9 dogs and 6 were euthanized
- 2 cats escaped during transfer / transport.
- 1 dog was returned to the owner


