Misc.:

- We will start advertising this week for the two open positions. We will post the job on the TML Career Website and also send flyers to the local academies.
- We are preparing for the Sat. Oct. 17, the parade and the festival in the park as well as for additional coverage for Halloween (it will be on a Saturday this year).
- We have the new Impala and hope to have it outfitted by the end of the month.
- Animal Control truck should be delivered this week.

Fire Marshal Update:

- Abandoned / Dangerous structures and Serious Code violations - Met with City Atty. and have developed an approach that will include the Fire Code, Building Code, Current City ordinances, and Health and Safety Code.
- Issued a permit for vent-a-hood and fire protection system at Rail Head Café & met with some potential developers.
- Issued 4 burn permits
- Regular Fire Inspection forms are on order.

Animal Care and Control:

We hope to have the new animal control pick-up this week. Animal control related calls seem to increase steadily. Every time the ACO takes action such as checking a trap, picking up a dog, responding to a complaint, etc. he assigns a case number and enters it in a log. This month he had 307 numbers assigned. He takes a lot of calls that would have in the past required a police officer response.


- Picked up 13 dogs
