Animal Control Update: We are making progress in developing our Animal Care and Control Division. A.C.O. Bill Dixon has been busy doing a lot of background work so when the shelter opens we will be ready to go. He has spent time with animal control officers from three different cities which provided him with some hands on experience and given him a lot of ideas. Bill has been working trying to solve animal issues by talking the complainants and addressing each problem as opposed to just setting traps. I will start providing a more detailed report next month.

Fire Marshal Update: We have already responded to a few complaints and Cpl. Dear conducted a state required inspection at the Lytle Nursing Home. Cpl. Dear will be spending a few days working with fire inspectors from Schertz to get some hands on experience. We still have some forms that need to be developed and other work before we will be 100%.


