CITY COUNCIL NEWSLETTER

Please be advised that the Council has a newsletter sent on a quarterly basis to inform and remind the public about important matters.

2016-2017 CITY BUDGET

The Lytle City Council adopted the City's budget for fiscal year 2016-2017 at the September 12th Council meeting. A copy of this budget is available for public inspection at the Lytle City Hall on weekdays from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. You may also view the budget on the city's website at www.lytletx.org. The 2016-2017 City budget is composed by the following:

This year's budgets for all of the city's departments are balanced. The general fund will be raised by about \$10,500.00 by ad valorem (property) taxes. Of this total, all of this tax revenue will be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.

2016 TAX RATE

The tax rate for 2016 was set at \$0.3725 per \$100.00 valuation. This tax rate is slightly higher than last year's rate of \$0.365 per \$100.00 valuation. The rate is apportioned as follows:

For maintenance and operations (M&O) of the general government (General Fund)-\$0.2912 for each \$100.00 valuation of property, and for the interest and sinking fund (Debt Service) - \$0.0813 on each \$100.00 valuation of property.

The M&O rate is slightly higher than last year's rate of \$0.2829, and the I&S rate is \$0.0008 lower than last year's rate of \$0.0821. This year the additional ½% sales tax saved taxpayers \$0.2203 for each \$100.00 valuation.

The 2016 taxes are due by January 31, 2017; however, if paid early, the City will allow discounts again this year. If paid in October, the discount is 3%; if paid in November, the discount is 2%; and if paid in December, the discount is 1%.

UTILITY RATES

Utility rates for the City of Lytle were **not** increased by City Council for the 2016-2017 fiscal year. Please check our website, if you have a question on the current rates.

Please be advised that the garbage rates may have to change, due to Waste Management renegotiating their current contract with the city. We will let our customers know something as soon as we know.

Also, the sewer rates were not changed by Council for the fiscal year, but this doesn't mean your sewer fee will not change. Please remember that your sewer fee is based on your water consumption during the previous winter months.

SEWER FEES

Sewer fees on your bill may change depending on last winter's water consumption. We'd like to take this opportunity to explain how your sewer fee is calculated. Your base sewer fee is a \$17.00 base rate. We then calculate how much water you used in the previous three (3) winter months of December, January and February and average that by month. This number of gallons per month is then multiplied by a rate determined by the gallons you averaged starting with \$0.50 per thousand gallons for the first 3,000 gallons; then \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons for the next 7,000 gallons and then \$2.00 per thousand gallons thereafter. Example: If your average consumption is 3,000 gallons per month your sewer fee will be \$18.50 per month.

We encourage everyone to fix water leaks that may cause your monthly average of water to increase, and therefore, cause you to have a higher sewer bill. If you have any questions on how your sewer fee is calculated, please call our office at 830-709-3692.

BRUSH PICK-UP

Your brush will continue to be picked up once a month this next year. **Again, brush pick-up is scheduled for the 3rd Monday of each month.** We encourage everyone to place their brush out by the curb where you normally place your trash can(s) and/or bag(s) by no earlier than the Saturday before brush pick-up is scheduled to start. We ask that you place your brush out no later than 7 AM on the date pick-up is scheduled to start. We urge everyone to please follow the instructions above to avoid having brush along the city right-of-ways for long periods of time and making our city look dirty. Over the past year, we have noticed that brush has been placed on the right-of-way just after brush is picked up, which means that debris will sit there for nearly a month before it is picked up. We ask that you **not do** this in the future, as we do try to keep Lytle looking as neat as possible.

UPCOMING CITY HOLIDAYS

Holidays that have currently been set up for City employees over the next three (3) months are as follows:

Please keep in mind that the City office will be closed on these dates. However, garbage services for residences will not be affected. Garbage customers with dumpsters will be affected by holidays, if they fall on Mondays and Thursdays.

Admission for this hayride is one (1) canned food or \$1.00 per person. Please remember that all children on the hayride shall be accompanied by an adult.

2016 CHRISTMAS DECORATING CONTEST

RESIDENCES

The city will hold a Christmas Decorating Contest for residences again this year. We ask that homes participating in this contest be decorated by November 26th in time for the hayride.

BUSINESSES

All businesses are encouraged to decorate their places for the Annual Decorating Contest. Deadline for the decorating is also November 26th.

NON-PROFIT GROUPS

As in the past few years, the city will sponsor a Christmas Decorating Contest for non-profit groups to earn much needed funds. As in the past, the city has designated publicly owned locations for this contest. The deadline for decorations is Saturday, November 26th.

CONTEST RULES

All Christmas decorations shall be up and ready to be judged by 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 26th for all three (3) categories listed above at the city's designated locations. If you want to be sure the judges look at your decorations this year, you can call the City Hall at 830-709-3692, option 7 and you will be put on the list for judging.

Cash prizes of \$500.00, \$250.00 and \$100.00 will be awarded in each category for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places respectively. These prizes will be awarded at the January Council meeting. Let's all try to make Lytle as bright as possible this holiday season.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS & BUSINESSES

We have several new things that will be coming to Lytle in the very near future. At this time, a new dialysis center is being built near the Best Western Plus on the IH 35 N. Access Road. There are six (6) more business lots located next to this dialysis center, so we hope to have six more new businesses locate to that area. Also, if you haven't already heard, a Taco Bell should be starting construction very soon. We are also hearing that another auto parts store will start construction soon. We also have apartments and duplexes that are in the planning stages, and already have the sites selected for those buildings. We hope to see these completed over the next year.

WATER CONSERVATION

We are happy to report that the Edwards Aquifer level is at fifteen (15) feet above the Stage I trigger level at the time we were preparing this newsletter. So, at this time we still do not have any water restrictions for our customers. If the rains continue, as predicted, this may be the first year in a long, long time that won't require water conservation measures due to drought. We'll keep our fingers crossed, say a prayer and do a rain dance to try to keep from reaching the Stage I trigger point.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS SERVE AS REMINDERS FOR OUR NEW CUSTOMERS:

BUILDING PERMITS REQUIRED

The City of Lytle requires its residents and business owners to get building permits prior to starting building projects, whether it's a new dwelling, addition to a dwelling or business, swimming pool, gazebo, deck, storage shed, etc. If you do not get a building permit prior to starting construction, the cost of the permit will be doubled. We urge everyone to comply with the city's building ordinance.

BULKY WASTE PICK-UP

Bulky waste is scheduled for the fourth Monday of each month. **REMEMBER THAT BRUSH IS NOT CONSIDERED** bulky waste. Also please remember, do **not** mix in brush with your bulky waste, or it will not be picked up.

AGAIN, WE URGE EVERYONE TO PLACE BULKY WASTE AT CURBSIDE THE WEEKEND PRIOR TO THE START DATE, SO WE DO NOT HAVE THE CITY RIGHT-OF-WAYS LOOKING DIRTY AND UGLY FOR A LONG PERIOD OF TIME. ALSO, REMEMBER TO PLACE YOUR BULKY WASTE WHERE IT DOES NOT CAUSE A PROBLEM FOR YOUR NEIGHBORS, OR FOR PEOPLE DRIVING DOWN YOUR STREET.

CAR LICENSE PLATE STICKERS NO LONGER AVAILABLE AT CITY HALL

Car license plate stickers are **no** longer being sold at the Lytle City Hall. The Atascosa County Tax office is sending their representative to the new Atascosa County Precinct No. 2 Justice of the Peace office instead. Property taxes for Atascosa County can also be paid at that office. We realize this will be a bit of an inconvenience, however, the tax office will be open **every** Wednesday.

The new office is located at 1567 FM 3175, (on the left side of road) just past the Benton City Water office. The phone number for the new office is 830-772-5854. The office hours are: 9:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., with a lunch hour from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. This new office will be a "**full-service**" tax office.

CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Lytle City Council meets on the second Monday of each month* at 6:30 p.m. at the Lytle City Hall.

*Note – December meeting is **usually** not held due to the holiday season.

CITY OFFICE HOURS

The City Office is open during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The City Hall closes for the lunch hour from 12:00 noon to 1:00 PM in order for the office to run as efficiently as possible.

CODE COMPLIANCE

We have a Code Compliance Officer that will continue to drive around the city and see that people comply with the city's ordinances. We ask everyone to keep their lots free of debris and junk vehicles to avoid a visit from the city's code enforcement officer.

CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS ACCEPTED

The City Hall accepts credit and debit card payments (Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover). You may pay your utility bills, taxes, fines, and other fees charged by the city with these four cards in the lobby and the drive-thru window of the City Hall.

DRIVE-THRU WINDOW

We'd like to remind everyone that the drive-thru window at the back of the City Hall building is open for their convenience during the hours of 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday and is closed for lunch between 12:00 noon and 1:00 PM. We do accept credit card payments at the drive-thru window.

GAS EMERGENCIES

CPS Energy operates and maintains the city's gas system. If you have a gas emergency, please call, (210) 353-HELP (4375) or toll free at 1-800-870-1006.

NIGHT DEPOSIT

A night deposit box is available for the convenience of customers paying utility bills and taxes. This drop box is located next to the drive-thru window at the back of the City Hall building.

OVERGROWN LOTS & YARDS

We'd like to remind everyone with property in the Lytle City limits that we do have an ordinance prohibiting lots and yards to become overgrown with weeds and debris (that includes old tires). If you are found to be in violation of the city's ordinance you will be notified to correct the situation within seven (7) days of the notice. If you do not clean the property within the allotted time, the city will be forced to send a police officer to issue a citation to you and then file a complaint against you in Municipal Court. This could lead to you being fined for every day your property is not cleaned up. We ask everyone to keep their yards free of weeds, trash and debris to keep our city looking neat and clean.

PHONE SYSTEM AT CITY HALL

The City Hall's new phone system has been completed, and can make things more efficient for our customers. Also, if the employee you are trying to reach is out of the office or busy, the new voicemail feature will let you leave a message for that employee.
