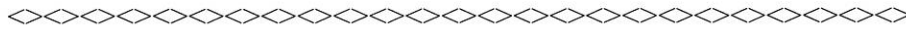


ORDINANCE NO. 22-11

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE APPRAISAL ROLL; SETTING THE TAX RATE; SPECIFYING SEPARATE COMPONENTS OF SUCH RATE FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS AND FOR DEBT SERVICE OF THE CITY OF LYTLE; APPROVING AND ADOPTING A ONE HUNDRED PERCENT (100%) ASSESSMENT RATIO FOR THE 2022 TAX YEAR AND PROVIDING WHEN SAID TAXES SHALL BECOME DUE AND WHEN SAME SHALL BECOME DELINQUENT IF NOT PAID TOGETHER WITH PENALTIES AND INTEREST; PROVIDING FOR COLLECTION AND ORDAINING OTHER RELATED MATTERS; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE



WHEREAS, the appraisal roll of the City of Lytle, Texas (the "City") for 2022 has been prepared by the Atascosa County Central Appraisal District Office and certified by the Finance Director; and

WHEREAS, a record vote was taken by the City Council on the proposed tax rate in accordance with State Property Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the Tax Rate was held by the City Council on September 12, 2022 according to Chapter 26 of the Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, after a full and final consideration, that City Council is of the opinion that the tax rate and ad valorem tax appraisal roll should be approved and adopted; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYTLE, ATASCOSA COUNTY, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1: Recitals: The preceding recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

Section 2: Tax Rate:

1. The ad valorem tax appraisal roll and the proposed tax rate for the tax year 2022, be and is approved and adopted.
2. This tax rate will raise more taxes for Maintenance and Operations than last year's tax rate.

3. This tax rate will raise taxes for Maintenance and Operations on the average home by approximately \$94.
4. There is hereby levied an ad valorem tax of \$0.3643 on each \$100.00 of property, real and personal, for tax year 2022 within the City which is not exempt from taxation under the State constitution or State law. The assessment ratio shall be One Hundred percent (100%).
5. The City Council of the City of Lytle, Texas, does hereby levy or adopt the tax rate on \$100.00 valuation for this city for tax year 2022 as follows:
 - a. 0.3139 for the purpose of Maintenance & Operation
 - b. 0.0505 for the payment of principal & interest (Interest & Sinking) on debt
 - c. 0.3643 as the total tax rate
6. That taxes levied under this ordinance shall be due October 1, 2022 and if not paid on or before January 31, 2023 shall immediately become delinquent. Taxes are payable to City of Lytle, or as designated by City.
7. All taxes shall become a lien upon the property against which assessed, and the city tax collector of the City of Lytle is hereby authorized and empowered to enforce the collection of such taxes according to the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and ordinances of the City of Lytle and shall, whether real or personal, for the payment of said taxes, penalty and interest, and, the interest and penalty collected from such delinquent taxes shall be apportioned to the general fund of the City of Lytle. All delinquent taxes shall bear interest from date of delinquency at the rate prescribed by law.

Section 3. Severability: It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of the ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and section of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 4. Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage.
